Induction Programme

Support for children with Additional Needs

- 3 days per week of 1:1 withdrawal support in Literacy and/or Numeracy with the Learning support teacher
- Classroom assistants who provide 1:1 or small group support on a daily basis
- The use of reading, spelling and number programmes recommended by outside agencies
- Two state of the art sensory rooms one on each site
- Staff who are trained in supporting children with additional needs






